MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

In 2022, we finally saw some of our activities in the club moving to in-person events. The Trust took advantage of this to hold many of our meetings in person, although we still made use of the zoom option if time or weather was a problem.

With the help of Janice Stonehouse, we upgraded our website to advertise the work we do both within the club and to the wider community. We hope this information will generate interest in our scholarship program and promote ideas for fundraising. We also developed a fundraising guide to help new fundraisers manage an event either virtually or in person. This includes dealing with sponsors, the city, and how to manage income and expenses.

In 2022, the Trust said thank you to Sandi St. Germain for her many years as Treasurer and welcomed Anne Brackstone as our member on the Awards Committee.

The online application process continued in 2022 although student applications came only from six of the ten area schools. We reviewed the candidates and chose six excellent students to receive scholarships.

The Awards Committee is working hard in 2023 to be able to award ten local scholarships. All letters and information distributed to French schools are now in French. We also heard from Carleton University about the 2021/22 winner of the Anne-Marie Dallaire-Sarazan Scholarship in Women's and Gender Studies, the winner was Eileen Naazie.

The author event with Elizabeth Hay and Alan Neal was the most successful fundraiser last year raising \$4,325.31 in the early part of 2022. The Christmas party at the end of 2022 also held an auction to support the scholarship funds and raised a further \$335. We have now sold Rotary Lottery calendars for two years and I think we should stop thinking of them as calendars and instead think of them as daily draws. Quite a few club members reported getting surprise cheques for \$25.

AWARDS COMMITTEE REPORT 2022-23

We bade goodbye to our chairperson Sandy Burger this year after a stellar service and were pleased to welcome Margaret Skinner, one of our new club members. Continuing are Lynn Payton, our computer guru and initiator of French communication with the French schools in our catchment area; our Trustee representative, Anne Brackstone; and myself as coordinator.

APPLICATIONS AND AWARDS

The application deadline for 2022 was in May, but we received applications from only six schools despite many reminders to the others. In June, six scholarships were awarded to the following graduates:

LOOKING AHEAD

Once again this year, the CFUW/Kanata Scholarship Trust will be offering \$1,000 scholarships to each school in our catchment area for a total of ten scholarships. In preparation for the 2023 Scholarship Awards, the committee met in the Fall of 2022 and scheduled the timeline for the process this year. Once again, students will be required to submit all documents to the Club in PDF format. This will ensure our easy access to their applications and preclude students making any changes after first submitting their application.

Earlier in the year, Anne surveyed the 2022 Scholarship Recipients about the ease and accessibility of the scholarship application: All the respondents reported satisfaction.

During this session, we made minor tweaks to the application form and created a brand-new poster. Information packages were then sent out to the schools in January with Lynn communicating with Ecole Secondaire Maurice-Lapointe and ES Paul-Desmarais; Margaret contacting All Saints Catholic HS, Sacred Heart HS, Holy Trinity Catholic HS, and Frederick Banting Alternate School; and Anne providing them to A.Y. Jackson SS, Earl of March SS, West Carleton SS, and South Carleton HS. All applications are expected from the beginning of May, and as in previous years, we'll evaluate them and select recipients based on the evaluation grid.

We look forward to having applicants from all the schools this year and awarding ten scholarships in person this year by CFUW members.
